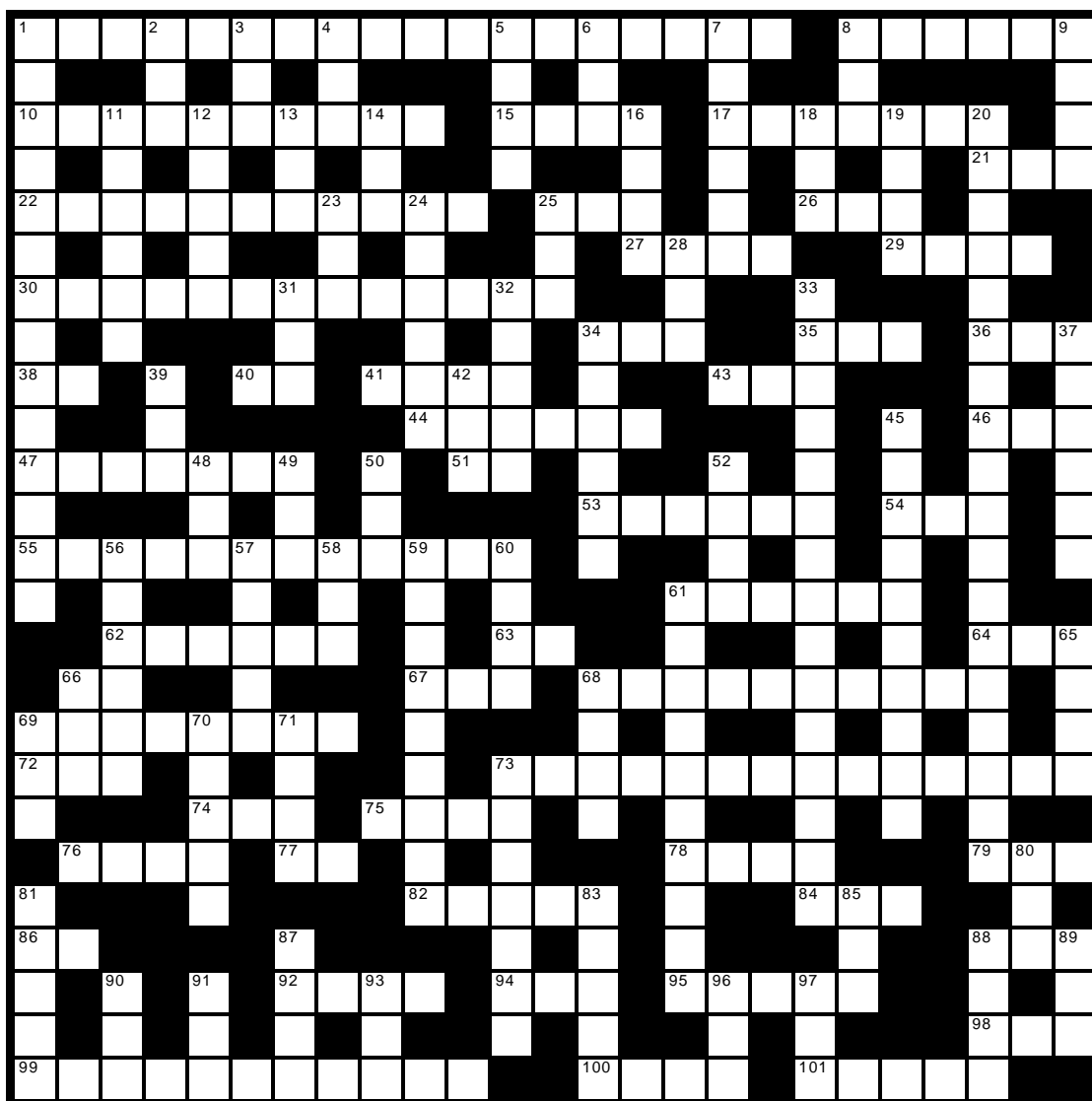


Crossword 2004
